Sermon Notes for June 9th

“What We Are Praying When We Pray the Lord’s Prayer”

“Forgive Us Our Trespasses as We Forgive Those Who Trespass Against Us”

Sermon Text: **Psalm 51:1-12 (p. 601)**; New Testament Text: **Ephesians 4:25-32 (p. 1244)**;

Gospel Text: **Luke 23:32-34 (p. 1124)**.

Read **Psalm 51:1-12 (p. 601)** while listening to the sermon, then answer the questions below.

1. Read **Psalm 51:1-2 (p. 601)**.

What sins has King David committed to make him so desperate for the Lord’s forgiveness?

On what two aspects of God’s character is King David relying for forgiveness?

According to these 2 verses what is God’s forgiveness capable of doing?

2. Read **Psalm 51:3-4 (p. 601)**.

Does King David need anyone to remind him of his sins? Why or why not?

According to v. 4, to what understanding has David come?

3. Read **Psalm 51:5 (p. 602)**.

According to this verse, what does King David recognize about himself?

4. Read **Psalm 51:6 (p. 602)**.

When King David mentions *the inward being* and *the secret heart*, to what is he referring?

Why might this verse give David hope that he could be forgiven?

5. Read **Psalm 51:7 (p. 602)**.

What was King David literally saying when he said, ***“Purge me with hyssop?”***

What was hyssop used for traditionally?

6. Read **Psalm 51:8 (p. 602)**.

According to the first part of this verse, what had David’s guilt and shame prevented him from feeling?

Did God actually ***“break David’s bones?”*** If not, what was David saying here?

7. Read **Psalm 51:9-10 (p. 602)**.

King David was asking for forgiveness here, but what did he desire even more?

8. Read **Psalm 51:11-12 (p. 602)**.

What does King David reveal in **v. 11** as the greatest danger of sin?

According to **v. 12**, what can we have through confession & repentance?

9. What does it show when we forgive others?

10. What will you remember most from this message?
