Celebrating Advent

On Sunday, December 3rd, the season of Advent begins. It is the first season of the Christian Church year, leading up to Christmas and including the four preceding Sundays. The definition of the uncapitalized word *advent* means the arrival of a notable person, thing, or event. Advent within the Christian Church celebrates the arrival of the long-awaited Messiah in a manger in Bethlehem over 2000 years ago. Advent also looks forward with great anticipation to the second coming of Christ, whose arrival will usher in the coming of the Kingdom of God in all its fullness.

As we celebrate Advent here at Trinity, I pray we would celebrate Christ's coming in three powerful ways. First, we would celebrate His birth, taking special notice of Jesus's great humility and love. My hope is that as we reflect on Christ's humility, that we would be moved to live out Philippians 2:1-8: So if there is any encouragement in Christ, any comfort from love, any participation in the Spirit, any affection and sympathy, ² complete my joy by being of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. ³ Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. 4 Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others. 5 Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, ⁶ who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, ⁷ but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. 8 And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Let us celebrate the birth of Jesus by putting the interests of others ahead of our own interests and by letting His love shine out of us daily.

Second, I pray we would be mindful of the mighty way Christ comes daily into the lives of those, who love Him and trust Him, in the person of the Holy Spirit. As we celebrate Advent, let us not do so complacently. Rather, let us daily hunger after every good thing the Lord has for us in each day. May we all begin our mornings, inviting the Holy Spirit to come and lead us in the way we are to live.

Third, I pray we would daily reflect on the second coming of Christ, realizing that with each passing day His return becomes more imminent. May we live out our lives as people who are looking forward to our Master's return. May we daily be doing the work of Christ so at His return, He finds us ready and can say to us, "Well done, good and faithful servant."

Advent and Christmas are wonderful seasons. I pray that as we journey through each season, that the Lord will draw you and your family ever closer to Him. I pray you will feel His presence, know His love, walk in His peace, abide in His joy, and live out His goodness.

"Something More in '24" Bible Study

Following an opening prayer, we will start each session by watching one chapter of the book of John on the Visual Bible. Every word spoken on this video is directly from the Bible. There is something powerful about hearing God's Word and seeing it walked out on the television screen before us. After watching the video, we will read through the chapter and discuss it verse by verse.

There is no need to sign up. Just show up with your Bible. You may find it valuable to bring a pen and a highlighter so you can mark significant passages and make notes directly in your Bible. If you like to make more detailed notes, you may want to bring a notebook, but only your Bible is required.

We recognize there will be days you can't attend. That's OK, since each week we will only cover one chapter. You can stay on track simply by reading the chapter you missed before attending the next session. Hope to see you there in January.

Prayer: How a Church Becomes Filled to Overflowing with the Holy Spirit

I am running this article again hoping to generate more interest.

I need at least 6 participants per class to make this work.

Deadline for sign-up is December 10.

Jonathon Graf, the founder of *Pray!* magazine, wrote the paragraphs that follow in italics: *How does a church become filled to overflowing with the Holy Spirit of God? There is only one way: through prayer. The Spirit's working doesn't come through gaining Bible knowledge, though that's important. It doesn't come through learning about leadership, though that's important. The Spirit's work doesn't come through dynamic small groups or the latest church growth ideas, though they are important, too. The transforming, life-giving work of the Holy Spirit only comes through powerful prayer. It comes through becoming a prayer-saturated church. How do I know this?*

Luke 11:5-13 is an interesting passage on prayer. Usually, this passage brings sermons on persevering in prayer. But there is a hidden little message in its powerful thoughts. At the end, Jesus says, "How much more will your Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!" The passage wasn't about the Holy Spirit; it was about asking for what we need—ask and keep on asking, seek and keep on seeking, knock and keep on knocking. And what do we get as we pray more and more? Luke says we get the Holy Spirit! We get the river of God that flows in and through us.

More than anything, I want our church to be overflowing with the Holy Spirit of God and growing in our ability to pray. Toward that end, I am inviting you to participate in a class based on a study of *The Prayer Saturated Church* by Cheryl Sacks. I'll be holding classes on Tuesdays, with a morning class offered from 10:00 to 11:00 AM, and an evening class offered from 5:45 to 6:45 PM. The odd evening time is to allow people to take the class and still be able to attend home basketball games.

Please don't exclude yourself from participating in this class. Please don't demean your own ability to pray. Please don't listen to the devil, who will do everything in his power to keep you from being a part of this class. Please do listen to the Holy Spirit. Please do believe God wants you to be growing in your understanding of prayer and your ability to pray. Please do imagine what God might be able to do at Trinity if we were to become a prayer saturated church.

There will be homework for this class. I will expect everyone to read one chapter of the book per week. There is no written homework, though you might want to jot down ideas the Lords gave you as you read. You may also want to highlight and bookmark sections of the book you found particularly enlightening.

This class does require you to sign up, as I need to know how many books to order. Please sign up on the bulletin board just outside the Fellowship Hall. Please indicate what class time you prefer and let's grow together in our understanding of prayer and our ability to pray. I am praying for two decent-sized classes, and I am praying you will be a part of one of them.

Community Alpha

We are working together with Calvary Baptist Church and New Hope Christian Camp to establish a Community Alpha in our area. We believe by working together on this project that we can greatly increase the number of people who will be able to attend Alpha. Though it is only an eleven-week course, Alpha has an outstanding track record for leading unchurched people to Christ and greatly increasing the faith of those who are churched.

Calvary will provide childcare for potty-trained three-year olds up to fourth graders. They will furnish a kid-friendly meal each week and provide some sort of activities that will help these kids grow in their knowledge and love of Jesus. We hope that providing free childcare will attract young couples, who otherwise wouldn't be able to attend.

New Hope will allow us to use their facilities free of charge and will help us in developing promotional materials. They will also provide a means of easy online registration. We are hopeful that using a neutral site will help us to attract some people who might be unwilling to attend Alpha at a church.

Trinity's role is to provide the meals for the adults throughout the course, and to provide the leaders and helpers necessary to facilitate the various groups. We would also provide the study guides and host and helper notes needed to run the class.

Here are ways you can be involved in Community Alpha:

- Sign up to attend the Community Alpha Course.
- Invite a friend or family member to attend the Community Alpha Course. Think especially of those you know who aren't walking with the Lord. (Their likelihood of saying, "Yes," increases if they find out you are taking part.)
- Serve as a leader or helper for the Community Alpha Course. (If you are willing, the training you receive will equip you to do your job well.)
- Help provide meals for the adult participants. (The key here is to get a few volunteers to work together to prepare and serve the food for one or more classes. Many hands make light work.)
- If you've taken Alpha before, give a testimony at our church or another church informing people of what Alpha meant to you. People are more willing to attend when they hear of the fun others had in their Alpha experience and the impact it had on their lives.
- Pray for Community Alpha and all those involved, including Pastor Dave Anderson from Calvary, Winston LaJesse, the director of New Hope Christian Camp, and me, as we plan and run the course.
