5. Read John 14:12 (p. 1146). How does this support the idea that Jesus wanted His disciples to teach new disciples exactly what He commanded His disciples in Matthew 10:7-8?

6. How does the last sentence in **Matthew 28:20** combined with **Matthew 28:18** give His disciples (and us) everything we need to carry out His commands?
