"Loving to Give; Giving to Love"

Sermon Text: Luke 6:27-38 (p. 1097); Old Testament Text: Proverbs 3:27 (p. 672); New Testament Text: Galatians 6:6-10 (p. 1239).

2. Read Luke 6:29.

4. Read Luke 6:31.

Does this verse make sense to you? Why or why not?

5. Read Luke 6:32-34.

In what ways are our love, our acts of kindness, and our generosity often motivated by

what we will receive in return?

Why does Jesus say this type of love, kindness, and generosity doesn't have much impact on the world around us?

6. Read Luke 6:35.

Why is God so pleased with us when we extend love, kindness, and generosity to our enemies?

Read Luke 6:36. <u>In your own words</u>, explain what it means to be *merciful*.

Is this a trait that you regularly display?

What two things does Jesus command us not to do?
