Sermon Notes for March 12th, 2023

"The Master's Model for Prayer"

Sermon Text: Matthew 6:9-13 (p.1031); Old Testament Text: Psalm 69:9-13 (p. 613); New Testament Text: Romans 12:12 (p. 1206).

Read **Matthew 6:9-13 (p. 1031)** while listening to the sermon, then, answer the questions below.

1. Matthew begins the Lord's Prayer with "***Our Father in heaven,***" while Luke begins simply with "***Father.***"

What great things should praying "***Our Father***" bring to mind for us?

What benefits are we reminded of if we simply pray, "***Father?***"

Why is it important to remember that God the Father is ***in heaven?***

2. What does ***hallowed be your name*** mean?

How did Martin Luther say we could keep God's name holy?

3. What three things are we asking God to do when we pray, "***Your kingdom come?***"

4. What are we telling God we will do when we pray, "***your will be done, on earth as in heaven?***"

5. What are we acknowledging when we pray, "***Give us this day our daily bread?***"

6. What are we praying when we pray, ***“forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us?”***

Does our salvation depend upon us being able to do this perfectly?

7. When we pray, ***“And lead us not into temptation,”*** are we asking God not to tempt us?

8. Why did Pastor Dave say he liked translations that said, ***“but deliver us from the evil one?”***

9. What will you remember most from this sermon?
