What did the people sitting in groups of fifty and a hundred bring to mind from the Old Testament?

What two things would the people sitting in groups like this have made easier for the disciples?

# 10. Read Mark 6:41 (p. 1071).

How many loaves and how many fish did Jesus bless and break?

How many loaves and how many fish did the disciples originally have to distribute?

Why didn't they run out of bread or fish?

How was this miracle like the story of Elijah and the widow of Zarephath? (Hint: If you can't remember what Pr. Dave said, **read 1 Kings 17:10-16 on pp. 379-380.**)

### 11. Read Mark 6:42-44 (p. 1071).

How many baskets of leftovers were picked up?

What did this number represent?

If there were 5,000 men present, how big might the total crowd have numbered?
