Sermon Notes for June 2nd

“What We Are Praying When We Pray the Lord’s Prayer”

“Give Us This Day Our Daily Bread”

Sermon Text: **Psalm 104:10-15 (p. 638)**; Old Testament Text: **Proverbs 30:8-9 (p. 700)**;

Gospel Text: **John 6:35-40 (p. 1135)**.

Read **Psalm 104:10-15 (p. 638)** while listening to the sermon, then answer the questions below.

1. **Matthew 5:45b** declares: *For He(God) makes His sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and the unjust.*
If this verse is true (And it is!), why should we bother to pray, “*Give us this day our daily bread?*”
2. Read **Psalm 104:10-11 (p. 638)**.
For what daily need do these two verses tell us God faithfully provides?
3. Read **Psalm 104:12 (p. 638)**.
What beautiful, unexpected bonus does this passage tell us God provides?
4. Read **Psalm 104:13-14 (p. 638)**.
Name three things this passage tells us God provides.
5. Read **Psalm 104:15 (p. 638)**.
Name 3 blessings this passage tells us God provides for the benefit of man.
6. Read **Proverbs 30:8-9 (p. 700)**.
How does this passage help us to see the focus on *daily bread?*

What two things is the author of this Proverb hoping to avoid? (See v. 8.)

What is he worried either of these two extremes might cause him to do?

7. Read **Hebrews 13:16** (p. 1286).

Why should praying “*Give us this day our daily bread*” remind us that we should be generous to those who don’t have enough to adequately provide for themselves and their family?

8. What will you remember most from this message?
