Sermon Notes for June 16th

“What We Are Praying When We Pray the Lord’s Prayer”

“And Lead us Not into Temptation”

Sermon Text: **James 1:12-15 (p. 1288)**; Old Testament Text: **Psalm 119:9-16(p. 650)**; Gospel Text: **Matthew 18:7-9 (p. 1046)**.

1. Read **James 1:12 (p. 1288)**.

What does it mean to you to *remain steadfast under trial*?

How could knowing that God really loves you enable you to *remain steadfast under trial*?

2. Read **James 1:13 (p. 1288)**.

If **James 1:13** is true (And it is!), why would we pray that God *not lead us into temptation*?

3. Read **James 1:14 (p. 1288)**. What does James identify as the source of our temptation?

Can you think of any godly disciplines that could help us from dwelling on our *own desires*?

4. Read **James 1:15 (p. 1288)**.

What does James say *desire gives birth to*?

What does James say *fully grown sin brings forth*?

5. Read **Psalm 119:9-16 (p. 650)**.

In your own words, describe ways the psalmist instructs us to keep our hearts pure.

How could *storing God's Word in my heart keep me from sinning?*

6. Do you have a go-to Bible verse that helps you resist sinking into sin?
7. What will you remember most from this message?
