Sermon Text: **1 John 4:7-21 (p. 1304);** Old Testament Text: **Psalm 136:1-3 (p. 660);** Gospel Text: **John 3:16-18 (p. 1130).** 

Read the Sermon Text from 1 John 4:7-21 (p. 1304) while listening to the sermon, then, answer the questions below.

1. Read **1 John 4:7 (p. 1304).** John is writing to people he has never met, why then, does he address them as *Dear friends*?

Why does John call us to love one another?

- 2. Read **1 John 4:8 (p. 1304).** Why does John say that failure to love others proves we do not know God?
- 3. Read 1 John 4:9-10 (p. 1304). How did God show His love to mankind?

According to 1 John 4:10, what is the ultimate evidence of love?

4. Read **1 John 4:11-12 (p. 1304).** According to **1 John 4:11,** why should we love one another?

According to 1 John 4:12, what does John say happens when we love one another?

5. According to 1 John 4:13, what is the evidence *that we live in God and God lives in us?* 

- 6. Read **1 John 4:14 (p. 1304).** John was a disciple of Christ and had seen all the amazing things Jesus had done, so he could easily *testify that the Father has sent his Son to be the Savior of the world.* Why can we do the same thing thousands of years later?
- 7. According to 1 John 4:15, what must we do to ensure that *God lives in us, and we live in God*?
- 8. According to **1 John 4:16**, we can *know and rely on the love God has for us* because we know the source of love. Who is the source of love?
- 9. Read **1 John 4:17.** According to this verse, what does *knowing and relying on the love God has for us* give to us?

What makes it possible that *in this world we are like Jesus?* 

- 10. Read 1 John 4:18. Explain what this verse means in your own words.
- 11. Read **1 John 4:19.** Why does our being able to love others depend on us first receiving God's love for us?
- 12. Read 1 John 4:20-21. Tell why these two verses make so much sense.
