Sermon Text: Matthew 22:1-14; Old Testament Text: Psalm 34:1-10; New Testament Text: Revelation 19:6-9. Read Matthew 22:1-14 (below) as you listen to the sermon, then answer the questions below.

Matthew 22:1-14: And again Jesus spoke to them in parables, saying, 2"The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a wedding feast for his son, 3 and sent his servants to call those who were invited to the wedding feast, but they would not come. 4 Again he sent other servants, saying, 'Tell those who are invited, "See, I have prepared my dinner, my oxen and my fat calves have been slaughtered, and ⁶ while the murderers the main y found, both ho had no hen the king ng of

everything is ready. Come to the wedding feast." ⁵ But they paid no attention and went off, one to his farm, another to his business, rest seized his servants, treated them shamefully, and killed them. ⁷ The king was angry, and he sent his troops and destroyed those and burned their city. ⁸ Then he said to his servants, 'The wedding feast is ready, but those invited were not worthy. ⁹ Go therefore to roads and invite to the wedding feast as many as you find.' ¹⁰ And those servants went out into the roads and gathered all whom the road and good. So the wedding hall was filled with guests. ¹¹ "But when the king came in to look at the guests, he saw there a man we wedding garment. ¹² And he said to him, 'Friend, how did you get in here without a wedding garment?' And he was speechless. ¹³ The said to the attendants, 'Bind him hand and foot and cast him into the outer darkness. In that place there will be weeping and gnashing teeth.' ¹⁴ For many are called, but few are chosen."
