"But Deliver Us from the Evil One"		
Sermon Text: Psalm 91:9-16 (p. 631); New Testament Text: 2 Thessalonians 3:1-5 (p. 1260); Gospel Text: Matthew 4:1-11 (p. 1027). Read Psalm 91:9-16 (p. 631) as you listen to the sermon, then answer the questions below.		
1. Read Psalm 91:9-10 (pp. 631-632). Does this mean that if we believe in Jesus nothing bad will ever happen to us? If not, what does it mean?		
2. Read Psalm 91:11 (p. 632). In your own words, explain what this verse means to you.		
3. Read Psalm 91:12 (p. 632). What does this verse tell us about God's heart for us?		
4. Read Psalm 91:13 (p. 632). To whom is the psalmist referring when he talks about the lion and the adder, the young lion and the serpent?		

What is the key for us if we want to receive the blessings described in these three verses?

5. Read Psalm 91:14-16 (p. 632).

	If we live this way, what will we know and what will God know?
6.	Read 2 Thessalonians 3:3 (p. 1260). Then read 1 Peter 5:8-9 (p. 1297). 2 Thessalonians 3:3 tells us that <i>God will guard us against the evil one</i> . While that is certainly true, according to 1 Peter 5:8-9, what is our responsibility in remaining safe from the devil?
7.	Read Ephesians 6:10-11 (p. 1245). If Satan has <i>schemes</i> and strategies to take us down, what must we have to stay safe from him?
8.	What will you remember most from this message?
