Sermon Text: Matthew 25:31-46 (page 1036); Old Testament Text: Psalm 34:19-22; New Testament Text: Romans 12:9-13.

6. Does this mean we are saved because of our works? Look up **Ephesians 2:8-10 (p. 1242)** and use these verses to justify your answer?

7. Why do you think the sheep were unaware they had ministered to Jesus when they ministered to the poor and the needy?

What does that say about the sheep's heart and Jesus's heart?

8. What prevented the goats from seeing the needs of others around them?
