"Who Will Tell Them?"

Sermon Text: Romans 10:8-17 (p. 1203); Old Testament Text: Joel 2:32 (p. 968); Gospel Text: Matthew Mark 16:15-16 (p. 1086).

Read Romans 10:8-17 (p. 1203) as you listen to the sermon, then answer the questions below.

Read Romans 10:8-9 (p. 1203).
 From what Old Testament passage did Paul "borrow" Romans 10:8?

What was Moses trying to convince the Israelites of in that verse?

What is Paul trying to get us to understand from these 2 verses?

2. Read **Romans 10:10 (p. 1203).** Explain what Paul is saying in this verse.

What must belief be for it to be real?

3. Read Romans 10:11 (p. 1203).

This verse is cross-referenced to Isaiah 28:16. Read the NLT translation: Therefore, this is what the Sovereign Lord says: "Look! I am placing a foundation stone in Jerusalem, a firm and tested stone. It is a precious cornerstone that is safe to build on. Whoever believes need never be shaken.

What does this verse tell us it is safe to build on the foundation of Jesus Christ?

4. Read **Romans 10:12 (p. 1203).** Why is this a good news verse for everyone?

5. Read Romans 10:13 (p. 1203).

What do you think it means "to call on the name of the Lord?"

6. Read Romans 10:14 (p. 1203).

What is Paul trying to impress upon us with the 3 questions he asks in this verse?

- 7. Read Romans 10:15 (NLT): And how will anyone go and tell them without being sent? That is why the Scriptures say, "How beautiful are the feet of messengers who bring good news! What would have to happen for you to consider that you've been sent to tell others the good news of Jesus Christ?
- 8. Read Romans 10:16 (p. 1203). What are two different ways "*But they have not all obeyed the gospel,*" might be interpreted.
- Read Romans 10:17 (p. 1203).
 When you read this verse do you have a better understanding of why it's so important to tell others about Jesus? Explain.
