1.	Read Matthew 3:13-14. Why was John the Baptist so opposed to baptizing Jesus?

2.	Read Matthew 3:15. How did Jesus's baptism fulfill all righteousness?
3.	Read Luke 3:21-23a: When all the people were being baptized, Jesus was baptized too. And as he was praying, heaven was opened ²² and the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven: "You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased." ²³ Now Jesus himself was about thirty years old when he began his ministry. What does this passage reveal to you about Jesus's baptism?

5.	Read Matthew 3:17. How would you have felt if you had been one of the people baptized with Jesus and heard what God said to Him?
