- 4. Read **Ps. 115:2-8 on p. 648.** <u>In your own words,</u> tell me why it is worthless to trust in idols.

5. Read **Ps. 96:7-8 on p. 634.** What does the word *ascribe* mean?

In your own words, tell me what these two verses mean?

- 6. Read **Ps. 96:9 on p. 634.** From what Pastor Dave said in his sermon, why should the *splendor of the Lord's holiness* cause us to *tremble before Him?*
- 7. Read **Ps. 96:10 on p. 634.** What did Pastor Dave say would be necessary for you to do before you could declare, *"The Lord reigns?"*
- 8. Read **Ps. 96:11-13 on p. 634.** Give some examples of how the heavens, the earth, the sea, the fields, & the trees glorify God with their worship.
