Being Made New in the New Year

And he who was seated on the throne said, "Behold, I am making all things new."

Revelation 21:5a

The words Jesus spoke in Revelation 21:5a pertain to the new heaven and the new earth He will create when He returns to bring His Father's Kingdom to fulfillment. The stain and brokenness of sin will be wiped away and creation will be returned to the glory it knew before the fall of man.

That is the context of that scripture reading, and yet, I believe Jesus is making that statement day in and day out, declaring He is daily making all things new for those who love and follow Him. He wants us to know He has a good plan for every one of our days. Toward that end, I want to give you two scriptures to lead and guide you through this new year.

Lamentations 3:22-23: The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness. Every morning, as you get out of bed, let the truth of this scripture passage wash over you. Wake up remembering God's love is steadfast, which means it is faithful, constant, ongoing, and unfailing. As the scripture says, God's love never ceases. He loves us with a constancy and consistency that fills our hearts with peace and assurance.

God's mercies never come to an end. His compassions never fail us. He is always ready to give us what we need, whether it's forgiveness, encouragement, comfort, wisdom, or discernment. His mercies are new every morning, which means to me, God has something new and unique for us in each new day. He doesn't want us living in the blessings of yesterday or yesteryear. Each day, He wants us to lay hold of the

unique blessings He has for us in that day. When we live in the moment with God, we will be more aware of His love, His peace, His joy, His presence, and His faithfulness. Remember God always keeps His promises, so we can utterly rely on what His Word tells us.

Ephesians 4:22-24: You were taught, with regard to your former way of life, to put off your old self, which is being corrupted by its deceitful desires; to be made new in the attitude of your minds; and to put on the new self, created to be like God in true righteousness and holiness.

This is another passage that lends itself well to early morning examination. As you take off your pajamas, imagine you are taking off your old self, removing all the guilt, temptations, shame, regrets, and disappointments of your sinful nature. If you take a shower before putting on your clothes, let the water washing over you remind you of the waters of baptism and how our sinful nature was crucified with Christ in baptism. Then, as you put on your fresh, clean clothes, imagine you are putting on the garments of righteousness given to us by Jesus. Though we ourselves are imperfect sinners, Christ has given us the perfection of His righteousness. When our Father in heaven looks at us, He sees us through the lens of His Son, the stain of our sins has been washed away and we are in right standing with God.

I'm convinced if we keep these two scriptures in the forefront of our thinking, 2023 will be the best new year we've ever experienced.

Praying your 2023 is truly blessed!

Happy New Year 2023,

We will be getting the booklets/study guide out to you as soon as we can due to storm/sickness things are taking longer. We will be studying Exodus, chapters 1-15. If it is decided there is another study that follows that finishes Exodus next year. There is a study guide for each circle to pass on to the next lesson leader. Here is an introduction to our lessons:

The Exodus narrative is a continuation of the story begun in Genesis. Genesis tells about God's work to make a new nation through which he will bless all peoples (Gen 12: 1-3) Exodus continues that story by showing how God proceeds to work out his plan, over many long years to make that nation into his chosen people, from whom the Savior of the world, Jesus Christ, would come (Matt. 1).

Part one of this study focuses on the first 15 chapters of Exodus, which make up one of the most memorable stories in the Bible. These chapters reveal the character of God and many of his attributes. They celebrate God as the deliverer of his people. The remaining chapters of Exodus (featured in Part 2 of this study) then describe how God makes his people into a nation unlike any other___ not for the purpose of being different, but ultimately to show God's love to the world.

Taken as a whole, the narrative of Exodus mirrors the redemptive plan of God for his children, even today. It gives us a fascinating glimpse of God's purpose throughout history __ to provide a divine mediator, Jesus Christ, who frees people from slavery to sin and leads them into full life with God forever (John 8:34-36, 10:10.

We hope that you all enjoy studying Exodus starting the New Year.

TASTY CREATIONS

Make this yummy treat to remember what happened on each day of Creation.

What you need:

- 6 large pretzel rods
- Candy melts (white, chocolate and blue)
- Green sprinkles
- White or star-shaped sprinkles
- Fish crackers
- Animal crackers
- Adult help



What you do:

- 1. With help, melt the three colors of candy melts in separate dishes. Microwave for 30 seconds at a time, stirring until soft.
- 2. Decorate one pretzel for each day of Creation:
 - Dip half in white and half in chocolate to show light and darkness.
 - Dip half in white and half in blue to show separation of the atmosphere.
 - Dip half in chocolate, add green sprinkles and dip half in blue to show land, plants and water.
 - Dip in chocolate and add white or star sprinkles to show the stars.
 - Dip in blue and add fish crackers to show sea life.
 - Dip in chocolate and add animal crackers to show land animals.
- 3. Share the Creation story and the snack with a friend!

- 4 nights of accommodations
