# Maintaining a Warm Heart in a Cold Winter

Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. 1 John 4:7

Given the early onslaught of winter this past
December, most of us are already sick of it. We're
tired of the snow that fills our feedlots, pastures, and
yards. We're tired of the ice that covers our roads,
streets, and driveways. We're sick of scraping
windshields, spreading ice melt on our driveways and
sidewalks, and having to bundle up like an Eskimo just
to go outside for a few moments. Parents are tired of
snow days and grumbling kids. Kids are tired of being
imprisoned in their homes and being unable to spend
time with their friends. Cabin fever is at pandemic
levels and winter has just begun. How will we survive

The answer lies in our featured Bible verse. In these long, cold days of winter, the love of God will see us through. His love will give us the ability to display the following virtues.

- Gratitude. Gratitude gives us the ability to see God's blessings in all things. Instead of grumbling about the snow, a grateful heart allows us to see the gift of moisture and nitrogen the snow has provided. Instead of complaining about cabin fever, a thankful heart rejoices in the blessings of a warm home. Instead of grumbling about scraping windshields, a grateful heart thanks God for a windshield to scrape. Instead of complaining about the kids having another snow day, a thankful heart rejoices in the safety of our children and the blessing of their company.
- Compassion. Compassion allows us to put the needs of others above our own needs. Instead of growing tired of the people with whom we share our home, compassion allows us to extend grace,

mercy, and forgiveness to our family members. Instead of losing our temper with our family and friends, compassion allows us to see the world through their eyes and helps us to avoid conflicts and confrontations with them.

- 3. Encouragement. Instead of lashing out at others in anger, God's love allows us to encourage our family, friends, and co-workers by speaking words of life into their lives. Encouraging words can completely transform the atmosphere of our homes, our schools, and our workplaces if we will allow God to use us as a spokesperson for Him.
- 4. <u>Joy.</u> One of the greatest benefits of being in a love relationship with God is the joy He puts inside us. That joy is meant to be shared with the people He puts around us. That joy is meant to not only lift our spirit, but also the spirits of every person we encounter. Let God's joy in you transform every environment you enter.
- 5. Love. When we are living in a love relationship with God, we become conduits of His love. The beautiful thing about God's economy is that He gives us far more love than we require for our own well-being. He gives us a lavish infilling of love so we can know we don't have to be stingy with it. We have enough to love God with more leftover to love those around us.

What we make of this winter, and what we make of our lives, fully depends on how we relate to the Lord. 
This craft celebrates that now we are light in the Lord (see Ephesians 5:8).

### What you need:

- A gallon zip-top plastic bag
- Permanent markers (dark colors)
- Black construction paper
- White cardstock
- Scissors

### What you do:

- Draw a self-portrait on the outside of the bag. Add details.
- 2. Insert the black paper and set the bag flat on a table. It should be tough to see your picture now.
- 3. On the white cardstock, draw a picture of a flashlight with a long beam of light coming out. Color the flashlight but leave the beam white.
- 4. Cut out the flashlight and light beam. Place them in the bag, over the black paper. When the white beam covers the black background under your picture, you can see your self-portrait clearly.



Answer: walk, light, light, fellowship, blood, purifies, truth, confess, faithful, forgive

# February Mission Offering – God's Way School




