Preparing Our Hearts for Lent

I think it's so appropriate this year that Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the Lenten Season, falls on Valentine's Day, a day on which we focus on those we love. While it's important to let your spouse, your children and grandchildren, your parents and grandparents, and your friends know you love them, isn't it even more important to let God know we love Him? May this be the Lenten Season we truly give our hearts to God.

What is Lent? Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and runs through Holy Saturday. It is forty days long, not counting the six Sundays in Lent. The number 40 represents the number of days and nights that Jesus fasted and was tempted by the devil in the wilderness. The Lenten Season is meant to be a time of reflection and self-examination for Christians. It is marked by fasting, self-denial, prayer, and moderation. Lent is intended to lead us to confession and repentance, a closer relationship with Jesus Christ, and a greater heart for the needs of others.

What is the significance of Ash Wednesday? Ash Wednesday is a day devoted to confession and repentance. Within most Ash Wednesday services is something referred to as the Imposition of Ashes, a time when the congregation comes forward to be marked with ashes by the pastor and whoever might be assisting him.

Ashes have long been symbolic of confession and forgiveness. Long ago, it was the custom during repentance to dress oneself in sackcloth and to sit in ashes and dirt. The sackcloth, which would be roughly equivalent to burlap today, was scratchy and uncomfortable. It symbolized the discomfort and pain

that sin brought to our lives. The dirt and the ashes had a dual symbolism. First, the dirt and the ashes symbolized our humble beginnings—the fact that God had created Adam from the dirt and upon his death he would return there. ("Ashes to ashes, dust to dust.") Second, as people confessed and repented before the Lord, they would pick up the dirt and ashes and pour it over themselves to symbolize the stain sin creates in our lives.

We put the ashes on our forehead to remind us we are sinners in constant need of God's forgiveness. The ashes remind us of our human nature—that we were created by God's hand, that we are mortal beings, and that we must constantly rely on Him to lead us to repentance. The sign of the cross on our foreheads reminds us of God's great love for us and the fact that we are forgiven by Christ's great sacrifice on our behalf.

In most Lutheran churches, when you receive the imposition of ashes this is spoken over you: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." While those words are certainly true, they do little to inspire change in us. That's why when you receive the ashes on Ash Wednesday, you will have these words spoken over you: "The kindness of the Lord has led you to repentance." The sentiment expressed in that statement comes from Romans 2:4 (The Living Bible): Don't you realize how patient he is being with you? Or don't you care? Can't you see that he has been waiting all this time without punishing you, to give you time to turn from your sin? His kindness is meant to lead you to repentance.

The February mission fund offering will be designated towards the God's Way Christian School and will be taken Sunday, February 18. God's Way Christian School serves the orphans and vulnerable children in an informal settlement in Morogoro, Tanzania. Through the transformative Gospel, GWCS is nurturing a generation in the knowledge of Christ.

The rapid growth has prompted an urgent requirement to expand our enrollment capacity. Presently, the school operates from rented buildings, and expansion within this space is not feasible. To comply with Tanzanian law and ensure continuity, we must construct our own facility. The local community has already contributed by purchasing some required cement, but there's still much work ahead. The first phase of construction is \$70,000. Please join us in supporting this ministry who serves orphans and vulnerable children. God knows our struggles with sin. He isn't surprised by them, and He isn't trying to cause us pain or embarrassment by reminding us of them. Quite the opposite, God is seeking to set us free from our sins by leading us to confession and repentance. There's nothing magical about the imposition of ashes. Those who are marked with them are not spiritually better than those who are not. But there is something powerful when we come together as a congregation with repentant hearts and admit our sinfulness to God and to one another. There is something powerful in wearing the ashes on our forehead, admitting we are sinners in desperate need of the forgiveness of our

Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. There is something very powerful about baring our souls before God—being completely honest and vulnerable before Him—confessing all that stands between us and Him—and turning from those sins back to Him.

Come join us for an Ash Wednesday service February 14th—either at Twilight Vista at 2 PM or at Trinity at 6 PM—and let the kindness of the Lord lead you to repentance. I hope to see you there as we begin our journey through Lent.
