Holy Week Through the Eyes of the Disciples

I cannot imagine what it was like for Jesus' disciples to go through that first Holy Week. Four days so filled with power and love that they transformed the world forever. What a roller coaster ride they had! On Maundy Thursday, Jesus shocked His disciples by picking up the basin and the towel, dropping to His knees before them, and washing each one of their feet—even the feet of Judas Iscariot, the one who would betray Him. Jesus took on the task reserved for the lowliest servant to model for His disciples how they were to live. They were to live as His humble servants, willing to do whatever it took to advance the gospel to those, who did not yet know Him.

As the night continued, they heard Jesus announce that one of the twelve would betray Him. Then, as they puzzled over that news, they saw the Passover meal transformed before them into the Lord's Supper. They saw Jesus pick up the unleavened bread and declare, "This is my body given for you." Leaven had long been a symbol of sin. So, when Jesus took a loaf of bread without leaven, and said, "This is my body," He was declaring that His body was without sin. He was announcing that He was the perfect sacrifice God would use to make perfect atonement for mankind's sin. Then, He said, "This cup is the New Covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin." Jesus was prophesying how He would die, and how His death would affect mankind. And after each declaration, first for the bread and then for the wine, Jesus reminded them to "do this for the remembrance for me."

After supper on Maundy Thursday, Jesus gave them this mandate found in John 13:34-35: "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. ³⁵ By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." Jesus distilled discipleship down to this one concept: loving others as He had loved them. Simple to grasp, but oh so hard to accomplish.

Maundy Thursday was jam-packed with instruction. Jesus prophesied Peter would betray Him three times before the rooster crowed. He taught them about the Holy Spirit and encouraged them to trust in His teaching and to walk in His truth. He taught them the parable about the vine and the branches and reminded them they were to produce fruit that would last. Jesus prayed His high priestly prayer for Himself, His disciples, and for all who would believe in Him. Then, He led them to the Garden of Gethsemane, where He prayed, was betrayed, and arrested.

Jesus endured a frantic schedule of late night and early morning sham trials, first before Annas, then before Caiaphas, then before Pilate, Herod, and back to Pilate again. Each stop was a new place to be tortured and humiliated. Though they couldn't produce any reliable witnesses, the Jews yelled long enough and loud enough that Pilate finally gave into their wishes and ordered that He be crucified. The disciples watched their Lord and Savior be scourged with whips, crowned with a crown of thorns that was hammered into His head with heavy clubs, and punched with fists. They saw His beard torn out by the roots, they saw Him spat upon, and they saw Him struggle under the weight of a heavy cross. They saw Him endure punishment so brutal and severe that Isaiah 52:14 was fulfilled: His appearance was so disfigured beyond that of any human being and His form marred beyond human likeness. His disciples saw their once great Lord reduced to a bloody slab of meat and then watched Him be nailed to the cross through His wrists and His feet.

When His disciples saw the Roman soldier pierce His side with a spear, oh, the devastation and confusion they must have felt. How could the Messiah be dead? How could He be wrapped in grave clothes and buried in a tomb? Wasn't His reign supposed to be eternal? Wasn't He supposed to lead His people into a whole new realm? There was nothing good about this Friday as far as His disciples could see.

But then, Sunday comes at last. The women go to

Jesus' tomb, and He is not there! The angels ask: "Why do you look for the living among the dead? "He is not here; he has risen! Remember how he told you, while he was still with you in Galilee: "'The Son of Man must be delivered over to the hands of sinners, be crucified and on the third day be raised again.' " "Then they remembered his words. Oh, how the hearts of the disciples soared when they were able to see Jesus once again. How they rejoiced to be able to touch Him, and to hear Him, and to share a meal with Him again! How glorious to remember His words and to see them fulfilled!

What about you? Have you witnessed Christ's journey of love and obedience through Maundy Thursday and Good Friday? Have you heard His promise of life and forgiveness in Holy Communion? Have you embraced it, remembering Him and the

cost with which that meal was won? Have you acknowledged the depth of love and obedience required by Jesus to willingly lay down His life for us? Have you marveled at the strength and courage it required for Him to endure the torture both before and on the cross? Have you rejoiced in the truth of Easter? Has your soul and spirit soared with His resurrection? Have you celebrated His victory over sin, death, and the devil and recognized it as your victory as well? Has it registered with you that death has lost its sting? Have you understood that because Jesus withstood His agony on the cross, we aren't subject to that same suffering? If you haven't come to those realizations yet, I suggest you don't know Jesus. Isn't it about time you do get to know Him?


WOW Mission Project




