Are You a Disciple of Jesus Christ?

Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me.

¹⁹ Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." - Matthew 28:18-20

The passage above is known as the Great Commission. Jesus spoke it to His eleven remaining disciples shortly before He returned to heaven. In these three verses, Jesus gave His Church its marching orders. This was the work He was calling His Church to do until He triumphantly returns. This is the work He has called us at Trinity Lutheran Church in Platte, SD to do.

So, my question for each of you is this: "Are you a disciple of Christ? Do you see yourself as someone who is following Christ?" In other words, are you in a love relationship with Him? Do you know Him? Have you experienced His love personally? Do you hear Him speaking to you? And if you do, are you obeying Him?"

"Are you being transformed by Christ?" Is He changing you little by little into Himself? Have you come to understand He is able to do immeasurably more than all we can ask or imagine? Have you come to that place where you trust Him so completely that you know He can even use people like you and me to accomplish His purposes? Have you yielded to the Holy Spirit and allowed Him to lead you where you are to go?

"Are you on mission for Christ?" Do you see yourself as a fisher of men? Do you see yourself, not only as a disciple, but also as a disciple maker? Do you believe God can use you to lead other people to Christ?

Most of you have probably never asked yourself these kinds of questions. But these are the questions

we must ask ourselves to determine if we are carrying out our Lord and Savior's instructions to His Church. I believe most of our congregation could say, "Yes," to the first question. I believe most of our congregation is *seeking to follow* Christ. None of us, including myself, is doing it perfectly, but I truly believe that is our desire.

It is at question two that many of you find yourselves unable to answer affirmatively. That's because transformation doesn't come simply through church attendance. Transformation comes by surrendering oneself to Christ. Transformation comes when we invite Him to be the Lord of our lives. Transformation comes when we accept Jesus on His terms. When that happens, we experience His life-changing love. When that happens, we come to understand what joy and peace and contentment are all about. When that happens, we begin to move in the power of the Holy Spirit. We come to understand His faithfulness, His power, His wisdom, and His love. Things that seemed impossible before accepting Jesus Christ as Lord now seem achievable.

Most of us couldn't answer question three affirmatively, but part of that is due to wrong thinking on our part. We thought of ourselves as lacking the ability to disciple others. We blamed it on our lack of biblical knowledge or our inability to communicate well. But Jesus tells us all it takes to be His disciple is love. Do you love Jesus? Then He has given you everything you need to be a disciple and a disciple maker. Go and love people wherever you encounter them. Tell them what you know about Jesus. Even if you only know a little, it is more than an unbeliever knows. Our job is to love others and to tell them about Jesus. The Holy Spirit's job is to help us to do that as well as we possibly can. seeds of love. The Holy Spirit makes them grow. We tell others our testimonies and the Holy Spirit allows them to hear the truth. We share our lives with others and the Holy Spirit makes them into disciples of Christ.

Recognize that discipleship happens anytime we invest our lives into the lives of others. Do you want to become a disciple maker? Here are some ways to get started. Volunteer to teach or help with Sunday School. Lead music. Play or sing in the Praise Team. Help with Confirmation. Invest your life in high school and middle school students. Be a mentor. Lead high school Sunday School.

Be an Alpha leader or helper. Take part in Alpha. Everyone of these things will help people grow in their faith and come to know Jesus better.

If you've never done so before, invite Jesus to be Lord of your life and ask Him to transform you into His likeness. Then, sit back and watch what He will do. And when He begins to move in your life, follow where He's leading and love Him and others like Jesus loves you.

Developing a New Attitude Toward Prayer By Pastor Dave

I have been somewhat surprised by the lack of interest on the part of our congregation in receiving prayer after the worship service, particularly when many within our congregation have been dealing with health problems. With hopes of encouraging more people to receive prayer, I now will expound on what receiving prayer isn't and what receiving prayer is.

Receiving Prayer Isn't:

- A sign of weakness. It is a recognition of our great need for God's presence and power in our lives.
- **Proof that there's something wrong with us.** It's proof there is something right with us as we affirm our reliance on God.
- **Time consuming.** From beginning to end, the whole process only takes five to ten minutes.
- A waste of time. People who receive prayer will always benefit from what was prayed over them—even if they don't immediately recognize it.

Receiving Prayer Is:

- **Completely confidential.** What you share in the Prayer Room stays in the Prayer Room unless you request it be added to the Prayer Concerns in the bulletin.
- A great way to receive healing. James 5:14-15 tells us: Is anyone among you sick? Let them call the elders of the church to pray over them and anoint them with oil in the name of the Lord. ¹⁵ And the prayer offered in faith will make the sick person well; the Lord will raise them up. If they have sinned, they will be forgiven.
- A great way to grow in your faith and your experience of Christ. Make a trip to the Prayer Room to request:
- ~ A fresh infilling of the Holy Spirit. ~ A fresh release of the Fruit of the Spirit. ~ A spiritual gift or gifts.
- ~ Understanding of God's call upon your life. ~ A new ability to understand and live out scripture.
- ~ A great way to seek God's help with relational problems. ~ A great way to seek God's guidance & direction.

Isn't it time you took a chance on prayer and discover how it might bless your life? All it will cost you is a few minutes and the humility it takes to admit you could use God's touch in your life.

Council Approves Process to Begin Replacement of AC Units/Furnaces

At their July meeting, the Church Council unanimously approved replacing the two air conditioning units and the two gas furnaces that serve the Fellowship Hall. These are the units that are in the poorest shape and have annually required the most repairs and service work. The Council opened bids from Severson Oil & L.P. Co. Inc. and Konechne Heating & Cooling at their June meeting and selected the lower bid from Severson's. The Council has agreed to pay for these units out of the Church Building Fund. Total estimated cost of the project is \$13,112.27. If any members feel called to help with these expenditures, you may contribute to the Church Building Fund.

While these units are ready to be replaced, there is no rush to do so. Work shall be performed as it fits the contractor's schedule. The next units slated for replacement are the two AC units and gas furnaces that serve the sanctuary. The Council hopes to replace those in 2024.
