

#### **Checking Your Spiritual Pulse**

"Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but the one who does the will of my Father who is in heaven. <sup>22</sup> On that day many will say to me, 'Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in your name, and cast out demons in your name, and do many mighty works in your name?' <sup>23</sup> And then will I declare to them, 'I never knew you; depart from me, you workers of lawlessness.' Matthew 7:21-23

I cannot imagine a more depressing message to receive than to hear Jesus say, *"I never knew you, depart from me."* Unfortunately, that is the message awaiting many "Christians" who equate knowing Christ with simply going to church or teaching Sunday School or serving on the Church Council.

I am particularly aware of this passage because I'm sure it's what I would have heard had I died before accepting Christ at 39+ years of age. If you would have asked me prior to that time, if I believed that Jesus died on the cross for my sins, I would have said, "Yes," in a heartbeat. If you would have asked me if I believed He was raised to new life on the third day, again, I would have answered without hesitation, "Yes." I mentally agreed with what scripture said about Jesus, yet it had little or no impact on how I lived my life.

The moment I invited Jesus into my life, I knew without a doubt that God loved me, and I loved Him. I knew that I was forgiven, and that heaven awaited me. I knew the Holy Spirit lived within me and would empower me to walk out the life to which Christ had called me. I knew that God had a purpose for my life and my life suddenly became more fulfilling and exciting. After years of hearing that God talked to us, I began to "hear" Him talk to me in various and sundry ways.

Inviting Christ to be Lord of my life also opened my eyes to my wickedness and depravity. Under the bright light of Christ's gaze, I saw the darkness within me and understood my desperate need for a Savior. I became convicted that I not only needed to refrain from doing evil, but that it was high time I began to do the good deeds for which Christ had created me. The presence of Christ in my life and in my heart transformed me, and the lifelong work of sanctification began.

I didn't write this article to make people feel bad. I wrote this article to lead people to a place of introspection and self-examination. I want people to embrace living faith in Jesus Christ, not rely on the ritual of dead religion. I don't want anyone to hear Jesus say, *"I never knew you, depart from me."* I want you to *know* you are in good standing with Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Toward that end, I invite you to answer the following questions to take your "spiritual pulse:"

- Do you know God loves you and do you love Him?
- Do you know and feel that you are completely forgiven?
- Are you confident in your salvation, and sure that heaven awaits you, not because of your goodness and perfection, but because of Christ's?
- Are you constantly aware that the same Spirit that raised Jesus from the grave is inside you?
- Have you invited the Holy Spirit to have His way in your life so you can walk out the life to which Jesus called you?
