Trinity Lutheran Church Council August 19, 2019

The meeting was called to order by President Lee Hanten. Pastor Ron led with devotional and prayer.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

The secretary's report was read. Todd Strand made a motion to approve with a second from Kevin Severson. Motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The treasurer's report was read. Todd Strand made a motion to approve with a second from Connie Kirsch. Motion carried.

TRUSTEE'S REPORT

MIDSTATE ACCOUNT: Right now Toby Qualm, Lee Hanten, and Wendy Wollman are on the account with Midstate Communications. Lee will contact them about adding trustee, Spencer DeHaan, to the account.

SANCTUARY LIGHTS: A few lights in the sanctuary are out and this will be addressed.

<u>TILES IN FELLOWSHIP HALL:</u> Some of the acoustic tiles in the fellowship hall are in need of repair. Contact will be made with the company who originally put them in.

DEACON'S REPORT

Shirley Johnson said visits have been made to members of the congregation.

OLD BUSINESS

<u>WEB SITE:</u> The web site is up and running. We are not streaming the services as we need another \$5000 to purchase equipment for that capability. Wendy Wollman is the administrator for the site so if there is anything that needs to be added, she would be the contact person.

SOUND SYSTEM: The sound system is working better.

NEW BUSINESS

<u>FURNISHINGS PRICE</u>: The council was asked to come up with a fair price for the furniture/appliances that Morris Johnson made available to furnish the parsonage. Toby Qualm made a motion to pay Morris \$500 with a second from Brad DeVries. Motion carried.

<u>PARISHONER INPUT:</u> Jim Holter, Jeff Olsen, and Jonna DeHaan attended a portion of the council meeting to inquire about what funds are being included in the "thermometer" scale for the basement project and why the building fund is not being used to fix the basement. Discussion was held if it is indeed an emergency that needs to be fixed right now or if we can leave as is without further damage until the money is in hand. It was decided there will be a congregational meeting during church on September 8, 2019 to give an update on the project and explain what funds are available for use.

<u>FUNDRAISER</u>: The next fundraiser for the basement project will be pledge cards. Pastor Ron graciously volunteered his wife to get those ready to pass out at the Sept 8, 2019 service.

<u>COMMUNION FREQUENCY:</u> Discussion was held regarding changing the communion frequency from monthly to twice monthly instead. The church by-laws were read and they do not state how often communion will take place. It was noted that changes can and will happen during this transition period with an interim minister and also when a permanent pastor is hired.

<u>CONFIRMATION CLASS</u>: Pastor Ron will be teaching the confirmation class. He will also be visiting the other classrooms. The Board of Ed will find someone to help with the confirmation class.

PASTOR'S REPORT

Pastor Ron provided a printout of the visitations and meetings he has attended since he has been here along with hours worked. Also listed baptisms, funerals, and nursing home/assisted living visits.

PASTORAL CALL COMMITTEE UPDATE

Kevin Severson gave a quick update. Ten resumes had been received. Seven of those candidates made the first cut and each one will be contacted by a member of the committee this week.

Connie Kirsch made a motion to adjourn with a second from Shirley Johnson. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Fall. It is a season that reminds us of endings. Once thriving leaves now drop from their branches bursting with color, but dying. Beautiful summer flowers have lost their grandeur and now succumb to hues of brown and gray. Colder temperatures flow in and bright, long days full of sunshine move out. We are caught between summer and winter in the fleeting uniqueness of autumn.

As we enjoy the changes of fall, let it remind us of a vital truth. I believe God intends for us to see with physical eyes something that points to a lasting, spiritual truth. When you look at a fallen leaf or disintegrating, summer flower, think this thought: "All men are like grass, and all their glory is like the flowers of the field; the grass withers and the flowers fall, but the word of the Lord stands forever." (1 Peter 1:24 NIV)

Let the crinkling leaves and fallen blossoms remind us of something God wants always at the base of our thinking—we are finite and fallen and soon to pass. Any glory we claim to have is as transitory as summer leaves. We live and we die. We seek to accomplish much, but in the end we disappear from this earth. We cannot prevent our own demise. We stand helpless before our "fall." Except for one thing!

Notice the severe difference God highlights between people and His Word. People wither and fall as the grass. God's Word stands forever! God's Word never bends, stoops, or loses its glory. Its beauty never fates; it's "color" never wanes. No season comes that stops God's Word. No weather pattern knocks God's Word down. No disease causes His Word to waste away. No disaster or tragedy causes His Word to twist or weaken. Through every change, through every heart break, through every earth-shattering event, through death itself; the Word of God stands!

God purposely showed us the drastic difference between our glory and His Word in 1 Peter to stay focused on Him and not our own selves. I believe on the reasons for autumn is to demonstrate through His creation an important reminder about human nature when compared to God. Our failing attempts and His trust worthy ways. Of Our sinfulness and His holiness. Of our dependence and His self-sufficiency. Of our need for His Word at the deepest and broadest levels.

You see, God reminds us at the end of 1 Peter 1:25 "And this the word that was preached to you." This is no small or incidental statement! The Word that stands forever



Thrivent Financial Members




Honor your grandparents with a gift that all generations can enjoy.

Search Committee Minutes

TLC Search Committee 8/18/19:

The committee met to review applicants that had responded to the letter/email/posting of the open pastor position at Trinity. The co-chairs, Jeff and Jonna, have been handling the applications and resumes. The committee members all received a copy of resumes for review prior to the meeting. There were 10 applicants at the time of the meeting. Upon some initial review, three were eliminated. The other seven we will be in communication with. Each member of the committee was assigned an applicant to review and reach out to correspond with. The committee agreed that there is no immediate urgency and we will allow some time for other applicants to roll in as well. We also plan to involve Pastor Ron at the next meeting to update us on feedback he is receiving from the people that could be helpful in our search. The next meeting is after worship on Sunday, August 25 where we will share updates on existing candidates and review any new ones.

TLC Search Committee 8/25/19:

The committee met after worship, and each member gave an update on the candidate they were to review and contact. One candidate has withdrawn his application due to a family issue that would not allow him to relocate. One more new application was received since we last met, and we will be in correspondence with him as well. We will continue to pursue candidates and filter for ones that are worthy of interviews. Pastor Ron was invited to share feedback he has gained from some of his visitation with congregational members. The committee will meet again on Monday, September 9th.
