

The 10 Commandments According to Jesus, Simplified and Intensified

When I teach our Confirmations students The 10 Commandments, I don't start at Exodus 20:1. I start instead at Matthew 22:34-40. You remember the story. A Pharisee, an expert in the law, asks Jesus, "Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?"

Without hesitation, Jesus replied, "'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments."

With His answer, Jesus distilled ten commandments down to two: "Love God and love people." And He tells us if we do this, we will fulfill all the law and the prophets. I like to make things as simple as possible when I teach, so this is where I begin. Instead of having to remember 10 commandments, students can reduce it down to two. Yes, I still make the students learn the original 10 Commandments and their meanings, but I remind them that if we follow Jesus's simplified approach, we carry out the ten, while only having to focus on His two.

You may think teaching the 10 Commandments according to Jesus waters down their meaning. Quite the opposite, when we lean into Jesus's teaching on the commandments, we find a stricter interpretation than that which was originally given on Mt. Sinai.

Take the Fifth Commandment, for instance, in which God instructed us, "You shall not murder." Now, listen to Jesus's interpretation of that commandment from Matthew 5:21-22: "You have heard that it was said to the people long ago, 'You shall not murder, and anyone who murders will be subject to judgment.' But I tell you that anyone who is angry with a brother or sister will be subject to judgment. Again, anyone who says to a brother or sister, 'Raca,' is answerable to the court. And anyone who says, 'You fool!' will be in danger of the fire of hell."

Jesus takes a commandment that clearly dealt with taking someone's physical life and warns us that when we are angry with someone, our thoughts can take us to a place where we are mentally considering the joy it would bring us to do away with them. He warns us, too, of the "character assassination" our hurtful words can inflict on another. His message seems to be, "Don't just refrain from killing someone, rather refrain from anything that would cause another person harm or despair."

Now, consider Jesus's teaching on the Sixth Commandment from Matthew 5:27-28: "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall not commit adultery.' But I tell you that anyone who looks at a woman lustfully has already committed adultery with her in his heart."

Jesus elevates the original commandment so that adultery is no longer simply the physical act of infidelity perpetrated against one's spouse. He expands it to include lustful eyes and sexual fantasies. He wants us to understand the many and varied forms of sin and temptation. It isn't only our actions that He's concerned about. It's also our words, our thought life, and our wandering eyes.

Jesus was always pushing the envelope on spreading His love to others. In Matthew 5:43-48, He even went beyond the Great Commandment. Listen to what He said: "You have heard that it was said, 'Love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute

you, that you may be children of your Father in heaven. He causes his sun to rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous. If you love those who love you, what reward will you get? Are not even the tax collectors doing that? And if you greet only your own people, what are you doing more than others? Do not even pagans do that? Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect." The giving of the 10 Commandments ushered in the Old Covenant, a covenant we imperfect people could never obey. Aren't you glad Jesus ushered in the New Covenant, the Covenant of Grace? Thanks to Him, we can be saved—not because we're perfect, but because we believe in the One who is perfect. The Law made us aware of our sinful nature. Jesus set us free from it! Have a wonderful month clinging to the love of Christ!

- 4. Play hide-and-seek with a friend. Take turns hiding the rocks in a room, sandbox or backyard. Give clues, if needed, and count the rocks as they're returned.
