A Non-threatening Entry into Discipleship

And he (Jesus) said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men." Matthew 4:19

Whenever I want to see a "deer in the headlights" look come over the congregation, all I need to do is to remind them that they've been called to make disciples. Perhaps, the lost look I see on people's faces is merely their confusion over what a disciple is. It seems that no matter how often we talk about the subject, people are still unclear about what a disciple is and how they are made.

At Trinity, we want to have a biblical definition of what a disciple is, so we rely on Matthew 4:19 to clarify things. According to what Jesus says in this verse, **A** disciple is:

- 1. First and foremost, a follower of Jesus. ("Follow me...")
- 2. Second, someone who is being transformed by Jesus. ("I will make...")
- **3.** Third, someone who is on mission for Jesus. (fishers of men)

Hopefully, when you read that definition, your first reaction is, "That's me! I *am* a follower of Christ, and I *know* I am being transformed by His Spirit, so that I *can lead others to Christ.* Own the title of disciple. Live in its power and its calling, and acknowledge the fact that you, along with every other believer on earth, have lots of work to do.

This article is about how you can live out your call as a disciple in a way that is not only non-threatening but is also fun and enjoyable. This is an invitation for you to join a small group at Trinity, and, in the process, begin to be both discipled and to help disciple others. How does that work? Let me explain.

Every small group—at Trinity or anywhere else—is always composed of people at various stages in their Christian walk. Some will have walked with the Lord for most of their lives and be very spiritually mature, while others will have just begun their walk and have much to learn. In between those two groups, will be people of varying degrees of spiritual maturity. What happens in small group ministry is almost organic, as longtime Christians disciple others simply by modeling Christ and showing how to grow in spiritual disciplines like, prayer, Bible study, and evangelism. But as the group continues to meet, the less spiritually mature begin to grow and find their voices to encourage, uplift, and strengthen others as well.

The great thing about small group ministry is that it allows us to disciple and be discipled without feeling uncomfortable. How is that possible? Because the members of your group quickly become friends, and you don't feel self-conscious or ill at ease sharing your heart with them. Small groups quickly become a place in which praying with and for one another becomes second nature.

Here are five benefits of participating in small groups:

- **1. Connection.** Small groups provide small intimate relationships where people suddenly feel they belong and are valued.
- **2. Impartation.** You don't just learn about Christ's love or compassion or unity or hospitality, you experience those things as others in your group extend those blessings to you, and you, in turn, extend those same blessings to them.

- 3. Support & encouragement. Small groups do wonders in providing godly comfort, wisdom, guidance, and encouragement. Leaving a small group should always leave you feeling like you've just had a little kiss from heaven.
- **4. Growing confidence.** As you share life with your small group, reading and discussing scripture, praying together, and simply telling others of the ways you've seen God at work in your life, both you and the members of your group grow in confidence.
- 5. Accountability. When small groups are functioning correctly, we see their members holding one another accountable through loving correction.

How Will Small Groups Work at Trinity?

Our small groups will be called Life Groups because that's what we will be sharing together. Ideally, they will have 8 to 12 people in them. This ensures that even when a few people might be missing, there should still be enough for a discussion, but not so many that people find it difficult to share. Most groups will be a mix of men and women, couples and singles but each group can decide on their own configuration. Each group will have a leader. This person isn't a teacher, but a facilitator, who leads the group through a discussion of the previous week's sermon. The group will read the scriptures from the previous Sunday aloud, then answer discussion questions about the sermon. You will be amazed at the insights you gain when a whole group shares their thoughts on a message and the scriptures supporting it.

Life Groups will be held in members' homes. The masks people wear at church tend to come off in the privacy of a home. The group will decide if they will have one permanent location or rotate from week to week from one member's home to another. Groups should meet weekly for 1-1/2 to 2 hours. I understand there will be weeks when people are not able to attend due to sickness, travel, work, etc. But if you commit to attending as often as possible, you will quickly discover the blessings attached to Life Groups.

Each meeting will have a component of study, sharing and prayer, and fellowship. Each group will determine what this looks like. The group Peggy & I were part of in Longview began with fellowship. We shared a light meal or snacks while catching up on the previous week. Starting with fellowship, allowed people who were running late to be there for the time of study, sharing, and prayer. We usually met for two hours, with 45 minutes devoted to fellowship, 45 minutes devoted to study, and 30 minutes devoted to sharing and prayer. Each group can structure their time together as they wish, but each should spend a similar amount of time in fellowship, study, and sharing and prayer.

I hope we will have both daytime and nighttime Life Groups at Trinity, and I hope we will have at least a few that are multi-generational. - Helped repaired glasses for one man
- Helped purchase medicine for one man
- Helped with warm clothes and mattress for one man
- 4 boxes of crayons

We are still going out to the streets weekly. Some weeks we see 4 or 5 families or more, while others we only see one. It's currently inconsistent, but we are thankful for the opportunity to brighten their days and help out a little. We always try to have something special for the kids: coloring sheets and crayons, stickers, a piece of candy etc. Thank you for supporting this ministry! We pray the Lord blesses the church and the individuals who are giving.
